Their homemakers can help with cleaning tasks that are getting harder to do, and also run errands for you. During this time of year yard work might be on your mind as well. They have a large numbers of volunteers available every fall to help with raking.

They now also offer Home Health and Safety assessments. During this one-hour visit, they



identify safety issues in your home and work with you to make the corrective repairs.

As a nonprofit, Senior Community Services offer their services on a sliding-fee scale based on income.

Recreational Fires: Play by the Rules

Residents who like to enjoy a small outdoor recreational fire should be considerate of their neighbors and make sure they are abiding by City ordinances:

- Outdoor fires are permitted between 9:00AM and 10:00PM.
- Keep fires small, less than three feet in diameter and two feet high.
- Burn only untreated, unpainted, dry wood. Never burn cardboard boxes, trash, or debris because the smoke can be toxic.
- Fires must be at least 25 feet away from a structure or combustible material and in a fire ring or pit with edges more than six inches high.
- Have a hose or fire extinguisher present.
- Postpone the fire when the wind exceeds 10 mph.
- Fire must be constantly attended by someone 18 years or older and completely out before being abandoned

Preparation for Election Day 2016

The City of Minneapolis would like to help spread the word about voting. Presidential candidates will be on the ballot in the November general election (Tuesday, November 8th) along with several other offices including every member of the state legislature.

Early Voting:

Any voter can vote early; no reason is needed. Early voting begins September 23rd for the general election. Early in-person voting is convenient and it especially helps voters who need special accommodations such as language support. Download and complete the absentee ballot application form in advance, and bring it when you go to vote. Find the request form and the addresses for all early voting locations at vote.minneapolismn.gov/voters/absentee.

Voters can save time on Election Day by taking these steps:

1. Pre-register or make sure you're registered to vote: vote.minneapolismn.gov/voters/register *There is still time to pre-register before the general election in November, but not the primary August 9th.*) People who vote in the August 9th primary will be registered for the general election

November. Anyone who moves or changes their name in the meantime must re-register.

2. Look at a sample ballot ahead of time and even bring it when you go to vote. Find your sample ballot at vote.minneapolismn.gov/voters/ballot.
