\$50 Camp Bovey Scholarships Available

Camp Bovey is a program administered through Eastside Neighborhood Services, 1700 2nd St. NE. Registration is currently open to campers ages 8–18.

Located on 200 acres, Camp Bovey has its own private lake used for environmental education and waterfront activities such as swimming, canoeing, and fishing. By teaching practical life skills such as accountability, cooperation, responsibility, and respect through simple, yet intentional programming, campers develop the self-confidence to make a difference in their communities.

Scholarships (or “Camperships”) are available. A \$50 deposit is required, but CCMT offers a Camp Bovey reimbursement program. **To be eligible for the \$50 reimbursement, you must show proof of payment and proof of your residency in the Marshall Terrace neighborhood.**

The Northeast Ride, slated for June 13, 2015, will take cyclists on a tour of NE Minneapolis, stopping at the neighborhoods' parks.

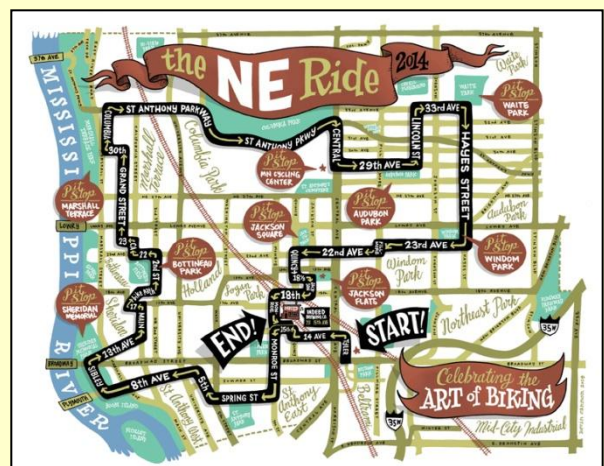

Community Coordinator Corner: Marshall Terrace Flooding

– A note from Community Coordinator, Shari Seymour

In late May, a Marshall Terrace resident contacted me to report the major flooding problem between 26th and 29th Avenue along Randolph Street.

This last rainfall was enough for the residents in that area: they had flooding of the streets, boulevards, sidewalks and some residents even had flooding into their yards from 12:00 PM to 9:00 PM Tuesday, May 26th. That night Channel 5 news (KSTP) reported the flooding problem on the 10:00 PM news.

Randolph Street is not the only street that is effected by the flooding during rain; Marshall Street (from Lowry Avenue to 29th Avenue) also has a flooding problem. I made a report with 311 on May 27th to have the City of Minneapolis Sewer department come out to scope and blow out the drains in the area.

Residents of Marshall Terrace, please continue to call 311 to report these issues. The more calls made to 311, the more record we have to support issues that need to be addressed in our neighborhood.

27th Avenue Street Repair

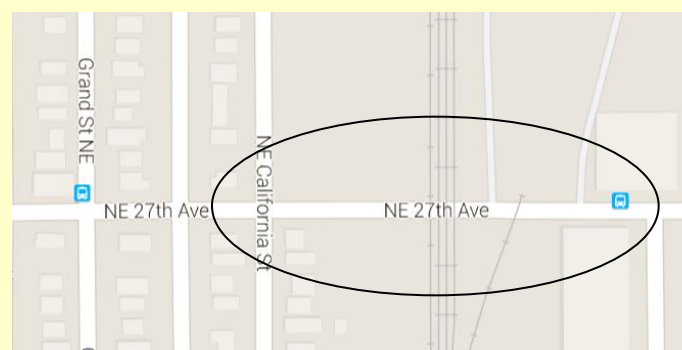
Many Marshall Terrace residents have noticed that the railroad tracks and the street on 27th Avenue between 2nd Street and California are in need of major repair.

The Concerned Citizens of Marshall Terrace (CCMT) Community Coordinator, Shari Seymour, has been in contact with the Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) maintenance division. BNSF is responsible for maintaining the railroad tracks and street repair within 15 feet on each side of the railroad tracks.

As of Friday May 29th, a report has been made to have the BNSF maintenance division go out and inspect the tracks. If they find that the tracks and/or the street is in need of repair,

they allow up to 30 days to complete the repairs.

If you would like to contact BNSF directly to get an update on the track repair, or to report the problem with the tracks and potholes yourself, you can contact BNSF directly at 1-817-593-6823 option "1". Their phone is available 24 hours a day.

Recreational Fires: Play by the Rules

Residents who like to enjoy a small outdoor recreational fire should be considerate of their neighbors and make sure they are abiding by City ordinances:

- Outdoor fires are permitted between 9:00 AM and 10:00 PM
- Keep fire small, less than three feet in diameter and two feet high.
- Burn only untreated, unpainted, dry wood. Never burn cardboard boxes, trash or debris, because the smoke can be toxic. www.minneapolismn.gov/environment/air/airquality
- Fire must be at least 25 feet away from a structure or combustible material and in a fire ring or pit with edges more than six inches high.
- Have a hose or fire extinguisher present.
- Postpone the fire when the wind exceeds 10 mph.
- Fire must be constantly attended by someone 18 years or older and completely out before being abandoned

CCMT Bylaw Amendments

At the April 17th Marshall Terrace general meeting, the public reviewed and approved amendments to the current Concerned Citizens of Marshall Terrace (CCMT) bylaws. The following are the amended changes to the Bylaws:

- Under the "Meetings" section, it has been added that online voting by a quorum of the directors is a viable option to pass motions.
- Under the "Fiscal Year" section, the fiscal year was changed from April through March to January through December.
- Under the "Conduct of Business–Robert's Rules of Order" section, it now reads that "meetings of the organization shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order Procedures in a Small Board."

CCMT board meetings are held on the 1st Thursday of each month, and public meetings are held on the 3rd Thursday of each month beginning at 7:00PM. Residents are encouraged to attend either or both.

Meetings are held in the Community Room at RiverVillage, 2919 Randolph St. NE.
