Mississippi River Paddle Share

Mississippi River Paddle Share is open for the season, and there's a station at Mississippi River Watershed Management Organization (MWMO) at 2522 Marshall St. NE!

Like the hugely-popular Nice Ride model, Paddle Share is an award-winning, first-of-a-kind self-service kayak sharing system in a national park that provides everything you need to get out on the water in the Mississippi National River and Recreation Area.

How it works: users can visit paddleshare.org to make a reservation, select the desired rental period and method of payment, receive an access code, and check out the gear (Wenonah Solara single and tandem kayaks, paddles, and life jackets.) There are three rental stations in Minneapolis, with plans to expand into St. Paul this summer. Reservations are available for morning, afternoon, and early evening paddles, Friday through Monday, and locations are aligned with Nice Ride bike share stations so you can paddle one direction and bike back to where you started. Northern Metals Recycling Settlement Update

Instead of using settlement funds to hold Northern Metals Recycling (NMR) accountable for the industrial pollution they have caused, the City of Minneapolis Department of Health has recommended that these funds go to existing City programs and the general fund.

NMR settlement funds that were earmarked for the City of Minneapolis total \$2,000,000. In March 2017, these funds were awarded to the City by the NMR agreement with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA). There are few legal strings attached to the dollars received by the City. The Health Department's assignment of those funds was put on hold at the City Council's Health Environment and Community Engagement (HECE) committee meeting held on May 15, 2017. HECE directed the Health Department to form a NMR Settlement Advisory Committee comprised of North/Northeast residents affected by NMR pollution.

Residents attending the HERC committee meeting sharply disagreed with the Health Department recommendations regarding the NMR settlement funds. The Health Department suggested the funds be spent like this: \$1 million goes to the City general fund (for street paving, etc.), \$600,000 would to be used on community health initiatives; current programs such as in-home lead abatement and asthma trigger education would get more funding. More air pollution testing would be funded.

The MPCA already has this covered: NMR's air pollution fallout area is currently being monitored with an additional \$500,000 in state money for the next 18 months. The expenditure of the remaining \$400,000.00 of settlement funds was unclear as to use.

National Park Service rangers from the Mississippi National River and Recreation Area will be joined by Mississippi Park Connection staff and guides from Wilderness Inquiry to offer free canoe rides.

56 Brewing Opens in Marshall Terrace

56 Brewing is the latest local business to move into Marshall Terrace.

Located at 3055 Columbia Ave. NE, 56 Brewing officially opened for business on May 1st. The owners converted the former diesel repair shop into a brewery & taproom that prides itself on creating synergy with the ground and brewery: "Garden to Growler."

"We were drawn to this space in Marshall Terrace because it allows us to be near a large, beautiful garden while still being in the City," said Chief Technical Officer, Joe Wirth, referring to 56 Brewing's location adjacent to the Marshall Terrace Community Garden.

"We're able to grow our own hops, mint, and lavender right on the premises which we then use in our beer."

56 Brewing is also testing out new theme nights like "Pinball & a Pint" Mondays, "Vinyl DJ Night" Tuesdays, and "Trivia Mafia Night" on Wednesdays. Food trucks are on premises Thursday–Saturday.

REMINDER: Recreational Fire Rules

Residents who like to enjoy a small outdoor recreational fire should be considerate of their neighbors and make sure they are abiding by City ordinances:

- Outdoor fires are permitted between 9:00 AM and 10:00 PM
- Keep fire small, less than three feet in diameter and two feet high.
- Burn only untreated, unpainted, dry wood. Never burn cardboard boxes, trash or debris, because the smoke can be toxic. www.minneapolismn.gov/environment/air/airquality
- Fire must be at least 25 feet away from a structure or combustible material and in a fire ring or pit with edges more than six inches high.
- Have a hose or fire extinguisher present.
- Postpone the fire when the wind exceeds 10 mph.
- Fire must be constantly attended by someone 18 years or older and completely out before being abandoned

Illegal burning can result in a \$200 fine. To report an illegal or unsafe fire, call 911.

Be a Good Neighbor

When you're planning to have a recreational fire, these simple suggestions could help make sure you're being a considerate neighbor:

- Postpone a fire when Minneapolis is under an air pollution advisory or alert. Fires release fine particles that contribute to air pollution and can aggravate a number of health problems, including asthma. Sign up for air quality alerts.
- Let neighbors know when planning a fire.
- Postpone a fire when smoke will blow directly at a neighbor's house or when still weather conditions prevent smoke from moving away at all.

The Fire and Police departments are authorized to extinguish the fire immediately if it is hazardous or unsafe.
