## Mississippi River Paddle Share

Mississippi River Paddle Share is open for the season, and there's a station at Mississippi River Watershed Management Organization (MWMO) at 2522 Marshall St. NE!

Like the hugely-popular Nice Ride model, Paddle Share is an award-winning, first-of-a-kind self-service kayak sharing system in a national park that provides everything you need to get out on the water in the Mississippi National River and Recreation Area.

How it works: users can visit [paddleshare.org](http://paddleshare.org) to make a reservation, select the desired rental period and method of payment, receive an access code, and check out the gear (Wenonah Solara single and tandem kayaks, paddles, and life jackets.) There are now five rental stations in Minneapolis and St. Paul. Reservations are available for morning, afternoon, and early evening paddles, Friday through Monday, and locations are aligned with Nice Ride bike share stations so you can paddle one direction and bike back to where you started. ## State Funding Approved for Upper Harbor Terminal Funding

The Minnesota State Legislature and Governor Dayton have approved a bonding bill that includes \$15 million for the Upper Harbor Terminal (UHT) Phase 1 infrastructure and park. When combined with the required local match, the City of Minneapolis and Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board (MPRB) will have \$30 million in funds for the first phase of public infrastructure (roads and utilities) and the first phase of park development. City and MPRB staff next will work to refine the plan as to which components will be included in the package, seek community input on appropriate aspects of the package, update cost estimates and map out a tentative timeline for implementation.

A companion request for some revisions to tax increment financing law to allow that funding tool to be used more effectively to implement the development plan was not approved and may be requested again in the 2019 session.

The City of Minneapolis, Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board and selected development team are wrapping up their initial research and work to find potential solutions for the many complicated topics that impact the feasibility of redeveloping the Upper Harbor Terminal. The hope is that the results of this process will be ready for community input soon, perhaps beginning in July. Watch for future announcements of community input meetings and other engagement options once the planning is completed.

The draft Mississippi River Corridor Critical Area (MRCCA) Plan chapter of the Minneapolis 2040 comprehensive plan is now out for community review and input.

## Marshall Terrace Crime Alert

There has been a recent rise in misdemeanor crimes in Marshall Terrace and the Northeast Minneapolis area. Specifically, there have been reports of:

- **Car window break-ins**

Vandalism took place in or near the Logan Park neighborhood in which driver's side windows were targeted; most were parked on the street and no one reported any items stolen from their vehicles. Police suspect a pellet or BB gun may have been used to break the windows.

- **Plants stolen from yards**

Numerous Marshall Terrace residents reported that plants in their yards were stolen in late May.

## REMINDER: Recreational Fire Rules

Residents who like to enjoy a small outdoor recreational fire should be considerate of their neighbors and make sure they are abiding by City ordinances:

- Outdoor fires are permitted between 9:00 AM and 10:00 PM
- Keep fire small, less than three feet in diameter and two feet high.
- Burn only untreated, unpainted, dry wood. Never burn cardboard boxes, trash or debris, because the smoke can be toxic. [www.minneapolismn.gov/environment/air/airquality](http://www.minneapolismn.gov/environment/air/airquality)
- Fire must be at least 25 feet away from a structure or combustible material and in a fire ring or pit with edges more than six inches high.
- Have a hose or fire extinguisher present.
- Postpone the fire when the wind exceeds 10 mph.
- Fire must be constantly attended by someone 18 years or older and completely out before being abandoned

Illegal burning can result in a \$200 fine. To report an illegal or unsafe fire, call 911.

### Be a Good Neighbor

When you're planning to have a recreational fire, these simple suggestions could help make sure you're being a considerate neighbor:

- Postpone a fire when Minneapolis is under an air pollution advisory or alert. Fires release fine particles that contribute to air pollution and can aggravate a number of health problems, including asthma. Sign up for air quality alerts.
- Let neighbors know when planning a fire.
- Postpone a fire when smoke will blow directly at a neighbor's house or when still weather conditions prevent smoke from moving away at all.

The Fire and Police departments are authorized to extinguish the fire immediately if it is hazardous or unsafe.
