## Spring Street Sweeping Begins April 17<sup>th</sup>

With spring approaching, Public Works crews are gearing up to start the City's street sweeping program to clear away the grime from winter. The City has scheduled **Tuesday, April 17<sup>th</sup>** for the first day of sweeping. Drivers should watch for temporary "No Parking" signs to avoid a ticket and tow.

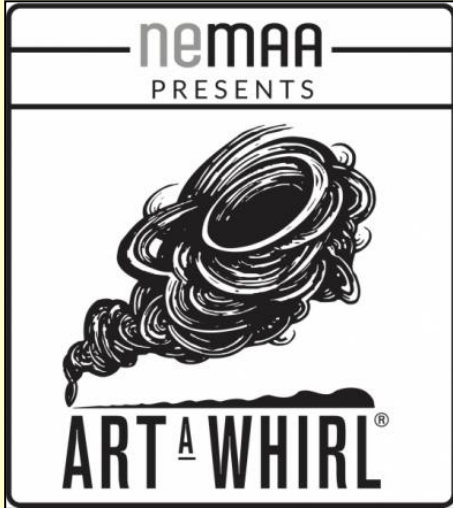
Starting April 17<sup>th</sup> for approximately four weeks, sweeping crews will take care of more than 1,000 miles of city streets in addition to sweeping alleys. To make sure the crews can do the most complete job possible, temporary "No Parking" signs will be posted at least 24 hours in advance to make sure streets are clear of parked vehicles. Drivers need to follow street sweeping parking rules or they may have their cars ticketed and towed to the Minneapolis Impound Lot.

Residents, workers, and visitors have several ways to find out more about street sweeping:

- "No Parking" signs – Crews will post "No Parking" signs at least 24 hours before sweeping any streets. Parking will be banned from 7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on the day a street is swept. The "No Parking" signs will be removed as soon as possible after a street has been completely swept to allow people to resume parking. Drivers should not park along these streets until these temporary "No Parking" signs are removed.
- Interactive web tool –Use a tool on the City's website to find out when the sweeping crews are coming through their neighborhoods. By the Friday before the first week of the sweep, people can go to [www.minneapolis.gov/publicworks/streetsweeping](http://www.minneapolis.gov/publicworks/streetsweeping) and click on "street sweeping schedule lookup" to find out which week a street is scheduled to be swept.

Minneapolis streets are swept completely curb to curb once in the spring and once in the fall.

## Community Meeting: Marshall St. Reconstruction/Great Northern Greenway

Join your neighbors for a Bottineau Neighborhood community Meeting on April 25<sup>th</sup> at 7PM at East Side Neighborhood Services (1700 Second St NE). Council Member Steve Fletcher will get things started with a 3<sup>rd</sup> Ward update.

Next, Hennepin County staff, Bob Byers and Jordan Kocak, will present the county's plan for a 2020 re-construction of Marshall Street NE from St. Anthony Parkway on the North to 10<sup>th</sup> Ave NE on the South (*just past the 1029 Bar*). This will be a total re-construction of Marshall with a new streetscape, underground utility replacement and more. It is also a once in 40-year opportunity to put in your two cents about the future of Marshall Street.

Finally, Great Northern Greenway bicycle volunteers, Dan Miller (*Bicycle Advisory Committee Representative from Northeast*) and Steve Brandts (*Capital Long-range Improvement Committee member*) will guide a discussion about BSNF bridge usage for bicyclists and pedestrians. We will also discuss progress on the 18<sup>th</sup> Ave NE bike path and other bicycle infrastructure in Northeast.
