Spring Street Sweeping Begins April 29th

Public Works crews are gearing up to start the City's comprehensive street sweeping program to clear away what had accumulated in the streets over the winter. The City has scheduled Tuesday, April 16, for the first day of sweeping. Beginning Monday, April 15, drivers should watch for "No Parking" signs to avoid a ticket and tow.



Starting April 16 for approximately four weeks, sweeping crews will take care of more than 1,100 miles of city streets in addition to 400 miles alleys. To make sure the crews can do the most complete job possible, temporary "No Parking" signs will be posted at least 24 hours in advance to make sure streets are clear of parked vehicles. Drivers need to follow street sweeping parking rules or they may have their cars ticketed and towed to the Minneapolis Impound Lot.

Residents, workers and visitors have several ways to find out more about street sweeping:

- **"No Parking" signs** – Crews will post "No Parking" signs at least 24 hours before sweeping any streets. Parking will be banned from 7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on the day a street is swept. The "No Parking" signs will be removed as soon as possible after a street has been completely swept to allow people to resume parking. Drivers should not park along these streets until these temporary "No Parking" signs are removed.
- **Phone calls to residents** – you may receive a short, prerecorded message the evening before your block will be swept. Calls are not made after 9 PM. This is a courtesy call, but they cannot guarantee that you will receive a call. To subscribe, go to www.minneapolismn.gov/contact-us/sign-up-for-news-alerts/phone-notifications/

Clean streets mean a healthier environment

Minneapolis is known for its sparkling lakes and waterways, and we want to keep it that way. That's why protecting and enhancing our environment is one of the City's top priorities. Street sweeping is one way we work to protect our environment because it keeps leaves, trash, and other pollutants from clogging our storm drains and polluting our lakes and rivers.

Residents should not push leaves, grass clippings, or anything else into City streets. It's bad for our lakes and waterways, and it's against the law. Anything that goes down a storm drain flows directly into our lakes, creeks and rivers, and decomposing plant material in the water encourages the growth of harmful aquatic plants and algae.

Project Update: Marshall, Grand, & California Streets in Mpls



For approximately 2 or 3 weeks beginning on **Monday, April 4th**, CenterPoint crews will replace the small-diameter plastic natural gas main on California Street NE between 22nd Avenue NE and Lowry Avenue NE. This is the first of the project's two natural gas mains.

What are the traffic impacts during this time?

- California Street NE between 22nd and 23rd Avenues NE
- The crew will close California Street NE between 22nd and 23rd Avenues NE, detouring through traffic to Grand Street NE via 22nd or 23rd Avenues NE.
- The crew will help residents maintain access.
- The southern sidewalk on California Street NE will be closed.
- Parking will be restricted on California Street NE between 22nd and 23rd Avenues NE and on 23rd Avenue NE between Grand and California Streets NE.

Lowry Avenue NE between Grand and California Streets NE

- They will close put up a lane shift on the southern side of Lowry Avenue NE between Grand and California Streets NE. Two-way traffic will be maintained on Lowry Avenue NE.
- The sidewalk will be closed on the southern side of Lowry Avenue NE between California Street NE and the alley between Grand and California Streets NE.
- Parking will be restricted on Lowry Avenue NE from Marshall to 1st Streets NE.
