

Free Trees for Minneapolis Businesses

Minneapolis businesses and nonprofit organizations are eligible for **FREE tree(s)** planted on their properties. Tree Trust will help choose, place, and plant the tree(s).

The business owner's only obligation is to care for the tree(s) over the years.

To qualify, businesses must:

- Pay a pollution control annual bill (a "PCAB" or pollution registration for equipment such as air conditioning units, public restrooms, restaurant hoods, etc.)
- Have enough green space to accommodate a tree or trees.
- Maintain and water the trees (especially the first two years).

In each planting season, tree(s) will be given on a first-come, first-served basis.

Open House: Accessory Dwelling Units

On June 13, Minneapolis City Council Member Lisa Bender, Ward 10, gave notice of intent to introduce **Zoning Code Text Amendment: Accessory Dwelling Units changes that would allow Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) in residential areas.** ADUs are smaller dwellings that are attached to or on the same property as existing homes.

ADUs are currently allowed with a conditional use permit in the North Phillips Overlay District but they are not allowed in the rest of Minneapolis. Many cities across the country allow ADUs, including Seattle and Austin.

To explore the idea of allowing ADUs in Minneapolis, staff from the Minneapolis Community Planning and Economic Development Department (CPED) will host open houses for resident input.

The beginning of each open house will feature a presentation that provides information about why the City is exploring this idea, a summary of peer city research and other information gathered to date. Following the presentation, a few basic designs will be presented and attendees will be invited to participate in small group discussions to provide feedback and ask questions.

The first day of school for **grades 1–12 is Monday, August 25th**, and **kindergarten starts Wednesday, August 27th**.

Our Northeast Minneapolis Public Schools have been and continue to be great places for my own children to learn and grow. If you have not visited our community schools, I encourage you to visit!

In Minneapolis, we serve families with a choice of community and magnet schools. Community Schools serve the immediate neighborhood and offer a well-rounded, rigorous curriculum for the whole child. Waite Park Community School serves as Marshall Terrace's community for grades Pre-K to grade 5. Pillsbury Elementary School serves other parts of Northeast and **MPS is excited to open a third option in 2015 at Webster Elementary.**

Magnet schools serve a larger geographic area with a specific curriculum focus. Marcy Open and Sheridan Arts are both magnet schools. Northeast Middle School serves all of Northeast and Southeast as a community option, and Edison is our local high school option. Both Northeast and Edison offer the International Baccalaureate Programme, which emphasizes an international perspective and individualized, rigorous programming for all students.
