## Minneapolis Snow Emergency Alert Options



Snow Emergencies are declared whenever there's enough snowfall to warrant a complete plowing of our streets. Vehicles parked on the street in violation of Snow Emergency rules can be ticketed or towed. Residents, workers, and visitors have a number of ways to learn when Snow Emergencies are declared and what to do when they are.

- **Hotline:** By calling the automated 612-348-SNOW hotline, residents can find out if a Snow Emergency has been declared. The hotline includes information in English, Spanish, Somali, and Hmong.
- **The City's website:** People can check [www.minneapolismn.gov/snow](http://www.minneapolismn.gov/snow) to find out whether a Snow Emergency has been declared and for a wealth of information on Snow Emergencies in many languages. The website also offers a street lookup so people can check an address or a neighborhood to see where parking is allowed during a Snow Emergency.
- **Phone calls to residents:** Minneapolis makes automated phone calls to alert residents when Snow Emergencies are declared. Anyone can add their cellphone or unlisted landline number to the system by signing up at [www.minneapolismn.gov/snow](http://www.minneapolismn.gov/snow).
- **Email alerts:** People can sign up to get Snow Emergency alerts automatically emailed. Details are at [www.minneapolismn.gov/snow/snow\\_esubscribe](http://www.minneapolismn.gov/snow/snow_esubscribe).
- **App for Android devices and iPhones:** People with have Android devices or iPhones can download the Snow Emergency app. During a Snow Emergency, the app will tell them the parking rules for that day. It also has a street lookup which allows users to see the parking rules in detail by entering an address or using the device's location services features.
- **The news media:** News releases are sent to the media so TV, radio stations, and other news outlets can inform their viewers and listeners that a Snow Emergency is in effect.
- **Cable TV:** People can tune in to Minneapolis City TV (Comcast channel 859 or CenturyLink channel 8502). These channels will have information in several languages when a Snow Emergency is declared.
- **Facebook:** People with a Facebook account can like [www.facebook.com/MinneapolisSnowEmergency](http://www.facebook.com/MinneapolisSnowEmergency).
- **Twitter:** People with a Twitter account can follow [twitter.com/minneapolisnow](https://twitter.com/minneapolisnow). Both the Twitter and Facebook Snow Emergency pages will tell fans and followers when a Snow Emergency is declared.

## NE Day Spot for Elders



Looking for a safe, engaging and fun place for the person you're caring for so you can take a break and get some respite?

At NE Day Spot, people with early to moderate memory loss and other health conditions make new friends, exercise their bodies and engage their minds.

This group respite program takes place every Friday from 10AM–2PM at East Side Neighborhood Services (ESNS), 1700 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave. NE.

A pre-assessment is required to determine eligibility, and the program runs on a sliding fee scale based on income (around \$0–\$45 per day).
