Use City Services for Storm Debris

Following the big storm, Minneapolis residents should continue to use the City of Minneapolis' regular yard waste services to get rid of small storm tree debris. These services include the collection of limbs that are less than three inches in diameter, are cut less than 3 feet long, and are bundled securely with rope or twine. The bundles should not weigh more than 40 pounds.

Yard waste and small storm tree debris is collected on scheduled garbage days. Residents should have their bundles of small storm debris at their alley or curb line, next to the garbage cart, by 6AM.

Phase I of Cancer/Air Pollution Death Study Results

Eastside Environmental Quality of Life (EEQL), a group made up of Northeast residents, released the findings of their Phase I study of Air Pollution Deaths in the area:

Data was derived from 19 years of vital statistics provided by the Minnesota Department of Health. They compared four census tracts surrounding the Lowry Bridge on both sides of the river to data from a same-sized control area in Mound, Minnesota.

Results show a rate of air pollution cancer-related deaths in the Lowry Area census tracts at more than 300% higher than the rate of air pollution cancer-related deaths in Mound. Death rates from asthma are 844% higher than in Mound. Results also show Lowry Area cancer deaths at a 19% higher rate than the U.S. as a whole.

The next phase of this cancer study will be to interview residents (and former residents) in the four Lowry census tracts to determine the extent of cancer illnesses among the living. The team responsible for this report consists of the following individuals: Tonye Slyvanus, the study's research coordinator, is a Master of Public Health candidate at the University of Minnesota and a practicing MD from Nigeria. Stephanie Yuen is a BNA and EEQL volunteer from Sheridan neighborhood who has a Master of Public Health degree focused on biostatistics and epidemiology from Oregon Science and Health University. We are thankful for their help, insights, professionalism, and dedication to improving neighborhood health.

Free Home Energy Squad Visits



For a limited time, the City of Minneapolis is offering free Home Energy Squad visits for income-qualified residents, including renters. All Minneapolis residents are eligible for a \$70 home visit, but to qualify for a FREE visit and 0% financing for recommended upgrades, your home must have an income of less than \$48,100 for 1 person, \$54,950 for 2 people, \$61,850 for 3 people, or up to \$90,650 for 8 people.

A team of energy experts evaluates energy saving opportunities in your home and installs free materials to help you start saving on the spot (door weather stripping, water heater blanket, high-efficiency light bulbs/water fixtures, programmable thermostat.) Your visit may also include: an air leak test; an infrared insulation inspection; a safety check of your heating system/water heater; an "energy fitness plan" (list of energy-saving priorities and financing information.)

If the Home Energy Squad recommends insulation or air sealing, income-qualified residents will also get special access to 0% financing to complete that work, and all participants will receive a personalized quote and opportunity to schedule the work with a qualified contractor.
