## Minneapolis Curfews for Juveniles

During the summer months, its especially important to be aware of curfew hours for juveniles.

Youth are the #1 victims of crime, and Hennepin County Ordinance #16 establishes curfew hours for juveniles. It also requires business places to abide by curfew ordinances and to report violations.

Crime Prevention reduces the opportunity for crime, helps people understand fear of crime vs. reality of crime, and increases neighborhood livability. Contact your crime prevention specialist for additional prevention information.

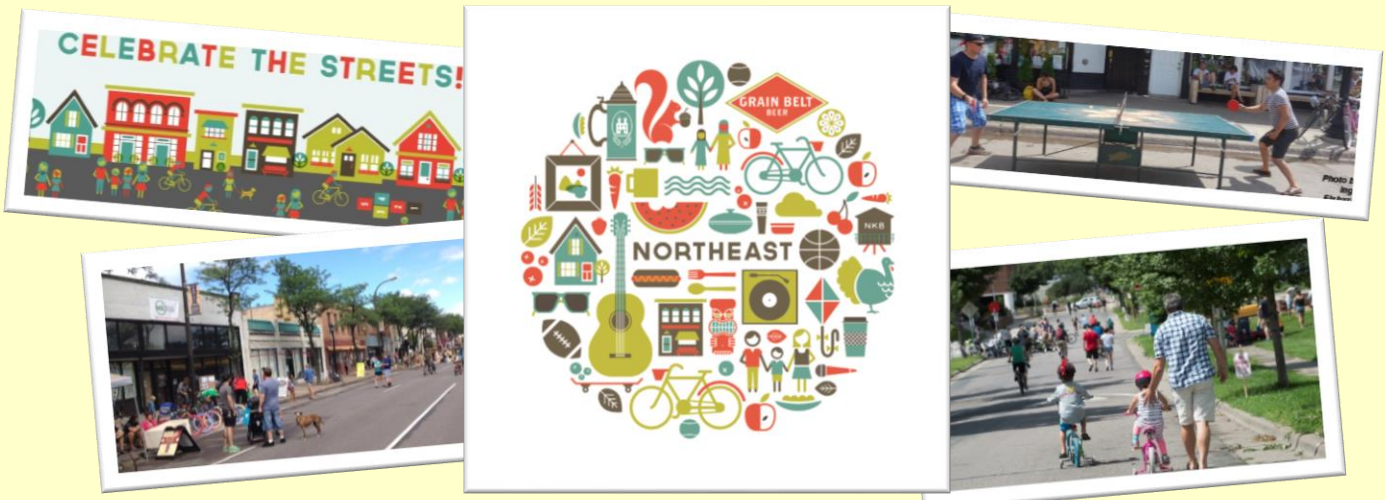

# Open Streets Minneapolis/Northeast: Sunday, August 4<sup>th</sup>

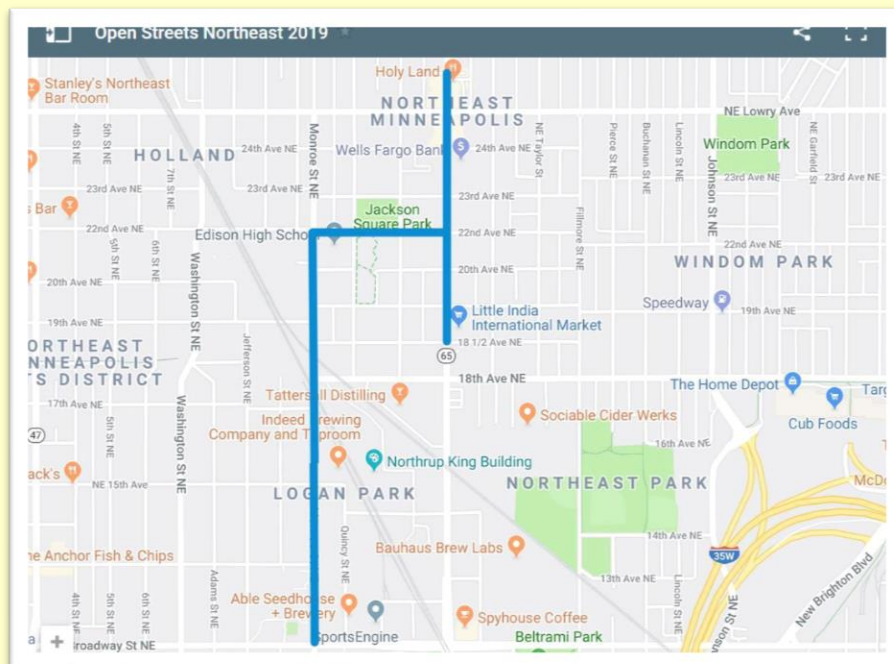


**Open Streets Minneapolis: Northeast**  
 Sunday, August 4<sup>th</sup>, 11AM–5PM

Since 2011, Open Streets Minneapolis has turned more than 28 streets into car-free, public spaces for a weekend afternoon. Building on the success of the first Open Streets Minneapolis, the Minneapolis Bicycle Coalition hosted a second Lyndale Avenue event and added one on Lowry Avenue North. From 2015 through 2017, the Minneapolis Bicycle Coalition, now Our Streets Minneapolis, hosted eight Open Streets Minneapolis events across the City each year.

In 2018, 93,000 people came to seven Open Streets Minneapolis events spanning 16.6 miles of streets in Minneapolis. These events were programmed by 600 street space hosts and powered by 323 Open Streets Minneapolis volunteers.

## Northern Greenway Overlook



The Minneapolis Parks Foundation recently announced the Great Northern Greenway Overlook, a RiverFirst signature project that is proposed to be completed by 2020.

The Overlook project is located at the east end of the 26<sup>th</sup> Ave N bike and pedestrian trail and it will be a key element in the future Great Northern Greenway, an east-west bike and pedestrian connection between Northeast and North Minneapolis.

The Overlook is the first of a multi-phase Great Northern Greenway River Link plan. This phase will transform a current dead-end street with shoreline rehabilitation and an overlook that incorporates lighting, furniture and art.

## Guide Teaches Residents How to Protect Water Quality



The Mississippi Watershed Management Organization recently launched a campaign to recognize and support “good neighbors” who take action help protect our water quality and habitat.

Its newsletter, the “Good Neighbor News,” features monthly tips and stories of local residents building raingardens, cleaning up pollution, and being good environmental stewards. Residents are encouraged to sign up for the newsletter and share their own stories on social media using the hashtag #MWMOgoodneighbor.

The MWMO also released a graphic booklet called the “Good Neighbor Guide.” Filled with fun illustrations and plain language, the guide teaches residents about yard care practices that can help reduce pollution from urban stormwater runoff. The guide recently garnered a Northern Lights Award from the Minnesota Association of Government Communicators.
