- 2) Low-Interest Loans (available for residents who meet eligibility and credit requirements)
- 3) Emergency Deferred Loans (available for case-by-case emergencies)

Minnesota FoodShare: March Campaign

The East Side Metro Food programs distributed more than 700,000 lbs of food in 2014. There were 5,000 clients served including 46,000 food orders. The East Side Mobile Food Shelf is the largest in the Twin Cities distributing 40,000 lbs of food each month with the help of 200 volunteers.

The Minnesota FoodShare March Campaign is an ideal time to donate to East Side's Metro Food programs, as 100% of the funds donated to Minnesota FoodShare during the month of March will be distributed to food shelves participating in the March Campaign, matching a portion of each participant's donation.




Central Avenue Reduced to One Lane Between 14th & 18th Ave.

MnDOT announced that Central Avenue between 14th and 18th Avenues will be reduced to a single lane in each direction beginning **Tuesday, March 10**. The lanes are expected to re-open in June.

The lane closures are needed so crews can continue working on Central Avenue beneath the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Bridge. The work includes building a retaining wall, building a new sidewalk under the bridge, and repairing the road. The work will result in a smoother, safer road surface, and improved accessibility for pedestrians.

Camp Bovey Registration is OPEN!

Located on 200 acres, Camp Bovey has its own private lake used for environmental education and waterfront activities such as swimming, canoeing, and fishing. Campers and staff sleep in one of six A-Frame cabins, each complete with electricity and 10 individual beds. Campers leave Camp Bovey with plenty of memories and new friends, along with life skills such as cooperation, confidence, and independence.

By teaching practical life skills such as accountability, cooperation, responsibility, and respect through simple, yet intentional programming, campers develop the self-confidence to make a difference in their communities.

Camp Bovey is a program administered through Eastside Neighborhood Services, 1700 2nd St. NE. Registration is currently open to campers ages 8–18. Scholarships (or “Camperships”) are available. A \$50 deposit is required, but **CCMT offers a Camp Bovey reimbursement program**. To be eligible for the \$50 reimbursement, you must show proof of payment and proof of your residency in the Marshall Terrace neighborhood. Time to Sign Up for City of Minneapolis Organics Recycling



Organics recycling is coming for Minneapolis Solid Waste customers. Residents now have a black cart for garbage and a blue one for recycling; organics will be collected in green carts. Any organics from the home can be put in the green cart for pickup on the same day as garbage.

Customers must opt in for this service and will be invited to sign up starting in April. But you don't have to wait; any Minneapolis Solid Waste customer can sign up now, giving the City time to order carts and plan routes. Service will be available to 25% of customers in August, and the rest will roll out in spring 2016.

What Can Be Composted?

Organics collection will include all food scraps, including fruits, vegetables, bones, meat trimmings, breads, pasta, nut shells, egg shells, coffee grounds, tea bags and dairy products. Some of these items can't be managed in a backyard compost. **For example, bones, dairy products, and meat are prohibited in home composting bins by City of Minneapolis ordinance. Other items that are dangerous to house pets and children and thus more difficult to manage in a home compost include fruit pits, garlic, hops (from brewing), and potato and tomato leaves and stems. These items would be more safely composted through the City's program.** Other items that could be included in the City's composting program: paper towels, napkins, facial tissues, wax paper, egg cartons, pizza boxes, toothpicks, dryer lint, animal and human hair and certified compostable plastic.

Opt In

The carts will only be distributed to customers who opt in. To get a green organics collection bin, Minneapolis recycling customers can request one at swrcustomer@minneapolismn.gov or by calling 612-673-2917.
