We have been receiving increased reports of stolen catalytic converters from car owners in Northeast neighborhoods. The thefts have been occurring at all hours of the day and night. Please be alert of any suspicious activity in your area and report it to 911. Any information you can offer to the police is helpful, especially:

- Plate number of suspicious person's vehicle
- Physical description of suspicious person

One sign your catalytic converter has been taken is if you start your car and it sounds unusually loud.

Please be safe and be cautious if you see suspicious activity! Report it to 911 and keep yourself and others safe until police arrive.

Message from Councilman Kevin Reich About COVID-19

As we all face the unique challenges of coronavirus disease 19 (COVID-19) together, I wanted to provide you with the information and resources I have at this time.

The Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) is leading the statewide response to COVID-19 and the City is working closely with MDH and Hennepin County. The City Council met today with the City Coordinator and City Department heads today to discuss Minneapolis' efforts to support all who live, work and visit in our city. Among the topics discussed, some key elements include:

- No one should have to fear losing water service at this time. Public Works has authorized a suspension of water shut-offs for the next 30 days, with further evaluation at that time.
- Limiting exposure at public meetings and arranging alternative opportunities for public engagement. While not all public meetings are cancelled at this time, we will be evaluating priorities and strategies to ensure that all can participate safely.
- Ensuring that the public has confidence in the security of our essential utility and First Responder services.

PLANS FOR OUR MT ANNUAL MEETING:

1. 6:30 – 8:00 PM: Upper Harbor Terminal Meeting

The 48-acre Upper Harbor Terminal (UHT) site is owned by the City of Minneapolis and located along the Mississippi River, generally between the Lowry Avenue and Camden bridges. The site is the largest remaining single-owner development opportunity along the river and offers almost a mile of riverfront in north Minneapolis, just over two miles from downtown Minneapolis.

With the March 2019 approval of a Concept Plan, the City of Minneapolis, the Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board (MPRB), the master developer United Properties and the community are midway through a planning process that will guide the redevelopment of the site. The goal is to transform this unique site to a combination of riverfront park amenities and community-benefitting private development. As of this writing, the plan also includes a 10,000-seat outdoor amphitheater for concerts.

This meeting will be an opportunity to learn about and discuss the plans for the development of this area, and residents' feedback is vital to the development of the amphitheater and the entire UHT area.

Board members will be nominated and elected to the Marshall Terrace Neighborhood Organization. If you would like to be a candidate, please attend and nominate yourself.

2020 Census Plan: Kids Count Too

Children are one of the most undercounted communities for the census. In 2010, children under the age of 5 were the largest undercounted group in the nation. And this year in Minnesota alone, 27,749 children live in hard-to-count areas.

Because the census helps determine which areas qualify for critical resources that many children and their families rely on, their proper count is critical to their future. Resources are allocated for the following 10 years – essentially an entire childhood – potentially affecting Head Start programs, food assistance, childcare and health insurance. Many services such as Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Women, Infants and Children (WIC) and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) rely directly on census data to allocate federal funds appropriately. It is vital to communities that all children – even newborn babies – are counted.

You can help by:

- Educating families on the importance of the census and the impact that it has on children and their futures.
- Sign up to become a Trusted Space host and assist your community in completing the census.
- Provide your community with census awareness and educational materials.
- Follow the City of Minneapolis or the U.S. Census Bureau on your social platforms to share critical census information with your networks.
- Sign up to volunteer for the 2020 U.S. census in your community.
