MTNO Board Chair, Long-time Marshall Terrace Resident, Mary Jamin Maguire Passes Away

Mary Jamin Maguire sought to better the world around her. She was Director/Therapist at Adler Center for Family and Community, Lead Trainer with the Positive Discipline Association to train parent educators, faculty member at Minneapolis Community & Technical College, on committees including Friends of the Mississippi River, Upper Harbor Terminal Collaborative Planning Committee, Marshall Terrace Neighborhood Organization, and more. She had a myriad friends and acquaintances, and — given half a chance — she'd brag to them about her accomplished children, Elsie and James, and her beloved grandson.

Raised in Croton-on-Hudson, New York, Mary was repeatedly told that she was not “college material.” But she not only graduated from Northland College, she also went on to earn an M.A. in Counseling Psychology from Adler University, was employed by numerous organizations as a therapist, social worker, or educator, and was in private practice for 24 years.

Mary passed away on February 26th, 2022 after a five-month battle with cancer. Preceded in death by grandmothers Elsie Hines and Isabell Jamin, father Joseph Jamin, mother Alice Jamin, and brother Michael Jamin. Survived by daughter Elsie Jamin-Maguire (Jack Ferro), son James Jamin-Maguire, brother Joseph Jamin, sisters Dorothy Jamin Lucian and Catherine Jamin-Kelly, grandson, plus legions of friends and family members who will miss her dearly.

A *Celebration of Life* will be held in June in Minneapolis, and a luncheon will be held in New York in August.

City of Minneapolis Tree Sale



In 2022, the City Trees program is working with Tree Trust (a local nonprofit organization) to provide 1,800 trees to Minneapolis property owners. Trees will cost \$30 each and all residents are able to order two trees per property. The ordering window for 2022 is:

- **8:00 AM, Monday, March 7th:** Green Zone property owners can begin ordering trees.
- **8:00 AM, Wednesday, March 16th:** Minneapolis property owners who haven't ever received a tree from the Minneapolis tree sale, who aren't in a Green Zone, can begin ordering their trees. Rental property owners citywide can begin ordering their trees, maximum of 5 properties. Please fill out a separate order for each property.
- **8:00 AM, Wednesday, March 23rd:** All Minneapolis property owners can begin ordering their trees.

Tree Purchase Details

- Order your tree at <https://mpls-tree-sale.myshopify.com>
- Purchasing will close April 15th or when the trees run out, whichever is first.
- Pick up your tree May 21st, 22nd or 23rd (*subject to change*).
- Location is to be determined and will be emailed to people who bought a tree.
- Don't know if your property is in a Green Zone? Check the map at www.minneapolismn.gov/greenzones or call 311. (**NOTE: A large portion of western Marshall Terrace is in a Green Zone!**)

All Youth Programs and Sports FREE This Summer at 17 Minneapolis Parks & Facilities, Including Bottineau

Registration fees have been eliminated for all youth programs, activities and sports leagues based at Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board (MPRB) parks, recreation centers and facilities located within census-designated Areas of Concentrated Poverty (ACP).

This new policy applies to any Minneapolis resident ages 17 and under signing up for any activity at one of 17 MPRB sites located within an ACP. It begins with the start of summer youth program registration, which opened March 2nd, and will continue through at least the end of 2022.

Sites with free youth programs include:

Bottineau Park, Central Gym, East Phillips Park, Elliot Park, Farview Park, Folwell Park, Harrison Park, Kroening Nature Center, Luxton Park, North Commons Park, Painter Park, Peavey Park, Phillips Park, Powderhorn Park, Stewart Park, Van Cleve Park, and Whittier Park.

In addition, three Rec Plus School-Age Childcare sites are now donation-based: Harrison Park, Matthews Park, and Webber Park.

How it Works

Visit minneapolisparks.org/register to browse all MPRB programs online via the ActiveNet platform. People can also drop by or call their local recreation center to ask about upcoming programs and sign up.

Youth program registration will be free for anyone with a Minneapolis address on their ActiveNet account at the 17 sites listed above.

People also have the option to pay for a portion or all of the regular fees during checkout.
