Paddle Share is launching for the 3rd summer on Saturday, May 25th. **Reservations for Memorial Day Weekend are now open!** Don't forget there's a station at Mississippi River Watershed Management Organization (MWMO) at 2522 Marshall St. NE.

Like the hugely popular Nice Ride model, Paddle Share is an award-winning, first-of-a-kind, self-service kayak sharing system in a national park that provides everything you need to get out on the water in the Mississippi National River and Recreation Area.


How it works: users can visit **paddleshare.org** to make a reservation, select the desired rental period and method of payment, receive an access code, and check out the. There are now five rental stations in Minneapolis and St. Paul. Reservations are available for morning, afternoon, and early evening paddles, Friday through Monday, and locations are aligned with Nice Ride bike share stations so you can paddle one direction and bike back to where you started. Recreational Fires: Play by the Rules

Residents who like to enjoy a small outdoor recreational fire should be considerate of their neighbors and make sure they are abiding by City ordinances:

- Outdoor fires are permitted between 9:00AM and 10:00PM.
- Keep fires small, less than three feet in diameter and two feet high.
- Burn only untreated, unpainted, dry wood. Never burn cardboard boxes, trash, or debris because the smoke can be toxic.
- Fires must be at least 25 feet away from a structure or combustible material and in a fire ring or pit with edges more than six inches high.
- Have a hose or fire extinguisher present.
- Postpone the fire when the wind exceeds 10 mph.
- Fire must be constantly attended by someone 18 years or older and completely out before being abandoned.





Want to do your part to improve the watershed that feeds the Mississippi River? Interested in a pollinator-friendly garden in your yard?

Raingardens are beautiful landscaping features that protect water quality and provide habitat for pollinators. They use native plants and capture rainwater runoff so it can filter through the soil instead of flowing into storm drains and directly into our lakes and rivers.

The Marshall Terrace Neighborhood Organization (MTNO) and Metro Blooms are partnering to work with property owners (residential, business, and places of worship) to install raingardens in the neighborhood. Property owners would pay for a small portion of the project. (Total cost depends on size and scope or each project.) Metro Blooms would design the gardens, coordinate the installations, and order materials, so all property owners have to do is plant.
