

## Snow Emergency App Available



Avoid the cost and hassle of a ticket and tow during a Snow Emergency.

The new and improved Minneapolis Snow Emergency app tells you if a Snow Emergency has been declared and puts all the parking rules right in the palm of your hand.

The app tells you where you can and can't park on Day 1, Day 2, and Day 3 of a Snow Emergency to help you avoid a ticket and a tow.

It also features a quick call button that connects you with the Minneapolis Snow Emergency Hotline, and buttons to sign up for email/text alerts.

## Minneapolis Snow Shoveling Rules

Keeping our sidewalks free of ice and snow is the neighborly thing to do, and it's the law. For your own benefit and to help your neighbors, people pushing strollers or using wheelchairs, and the many people in Minneapolis who walk, please do your part.

Minneapolis Ordinance requires that property owners clear sidewalks after the end of a snowfall within:

- 24 hours for single family homes and duplexes
- Four daytime hours for apartments, commercial buildings, and all other properties (daytime hours begin at 8:00AM)



When you shovel snow and clear ice:

- Shovel the sidewalks on all sides of your property, the full width of the sidewalk down to the bare pavement.
- Remove all ice from sidewalks.
- Pile snow into your yard and boulevard. *It's against the law to shovel snow into streets and alleys.*

If you have a corner property, clear pedestrian ramps at the street corners and crosswalks to the street gutter. (You are not required to clear snow ridges or piles left by the plows beyond the gutter.) City crews will make an effort to return to do this work as quickly as possible, but it may take a while. However, your neighbors would appreciate it if you could clear the pile (or at least an opening) sooner to help shorten the wait and provide a clear passage. ## Restoration of Hall's Island Along Northeast Riverfront Begins

The Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board (MPRB) is excited to announce that construction begins in November on a project that will restore Hall's Island along the Northeast Minneapolis riverfront. Work will be based out of the Scherer site, an 11-acre piece of land directly north of the Plymouth Avenue Bridge that was purchased by the MPRB in 2010.

Restoring Hall's Island will be an important milestone in the long-term vision laid out for Upper Riverfront in RiverFirst and Above the Falls Master Plan. These plans call for the incremental transformation of more than 11 miles of largely inaccessible shoreline degraded through decades of industrial use into an ecologically valuable network of parkland and trails.


Work to construct the island will include expanding the existing shoreline into the river and carving out a back channel through the Scherer site to form the island. This phase of the project is expected to last up to eight months.

## Midwest Northern Nut Celebrates 50 Years!

## STAP Bridge is OPEN!



The new St. Anthony Parkway Bridge, which opened to traffic on October 27<sup>th</sup>, features a space-frame through-truss that references the historic Warren through-trusses of the original bridge.

The new structure also includes a 14-foot pedestrian/bike path on the south side and a 10-foot sidewalk on the north side. At the west end of the bridge, an interpretive plaza will hold remnant pieces of the historic bridge, as well as interpretive panels that illustrate the history of the bridge and the surrounding area.
