

Snow Emergency App Available



Avoid the cost and hassle of a ticket and tow during a Snow Emergency.

The new and improved Minneapolis Snow Emergency app tells you if a Snow Emergency has been declared and puts all the parking rules right in the palm of your hand.

The app tells you where you can and can't park on Day 1, Day 2, and Day 3 of a Snow Emergency to help you avoid a ticket and a tow.

It also features a quick call button that connects you with the Minneapolis Snow Emergency Hotline, and buttons to sign up for email/text alerts.

Minneapolis Snow Shoveling Rules

Keeping our sidewalks free of ice and snow is the neighborly thing to do, and it's the law. For your own benefit and to help your neighbors, people pushing strollers or using wheelchairs, and the many people in Minneapolis who walk, please do your part.

Minneapolis Ordinance requires that property owners clear sidewalks after the end of a snowfall within:

- 24 hours for single family homes and duplexes
- Four daytime hours for apartments, commercial buildings, and all other properties (daytime hours begin at 8:00AM)



When you shovel snow and clear ice:

- Shovel the sidewalks on all sides of your property, the full width of the sidewalk down to the bare pavement.
- Remove all ice from sidewalks.
- Pile snow into your yard and boulevard. *It's against the law to shovel snow into streets and alleys.*

If you have a corner property, clear pedestrian ramps at the street corners and crosswalks to the street gutter. (You are not required to clear snow ridges or piles left by the plows beyond the gutter.) City crews will make an effort to return to do this work as quickly as possible, but it may take a while. However, your neighbors would appreciate it if you could clear the pile (or at least an opening) sooner to help shorten the wait and provide a clear passage. Avoid the cost of having the City clear your sidewalk

If the City of Minneapolis gets a complaint or discovers that a sidewalk is not properly cleared, Public Works will inspect the sidewalk and give the property owners a chance to clear it.

If the sidewalk has not been cleared upon re-inspection, the property owner may be issued a citation with a fine, and crews will remove the snow and ice from the sidewalk. Property owners will be billed for this service, and unpaid bills will be added to property tax statements.

Remember:

- You are responsible for clearing ice on your sidewalk as well as snow. Ice can be more dangerous and intimidating than snow.
- The sooner and more completely you shovel, the less likely it is that the snow will become compacted ice which is much more difficult to remove.
- Arrange for someone to shovel anytime you are away.
- Shovel around your garbage carts and recycling bins. If you don't, the City will do it for you and charge a fee.

Canadian Pacific Holiday Train Arrives December 11th



The CP Holiday Train program launched in 1999 and has since raised more than C\$14.5 million and gathered 4.3 million pounds of food for communities along CP's routes in Canada and the United States.

Beginning in Montreal on November 25th and 27th respectively, two trains will make the festive journey, travelling through both the U.S. and Canada to bring holiday cheer to 164 communities along CP's network. Each event is free, with CP encouraging attendees to open their cupboards and wallets to help address hunger needs in their communities. Local food banks will be accepting donations at each stop to ensure those less fortunate have enough healthy food this holiday season.

The U.S.-bound train will depart from Montreal on November 25th and head south. Sam Roberts Band and JoJo Mason entertain crowds at stops in Quebec, New York and Ontario. The Trews will then hop on board with Willy Porter in Chicago to complete the trip through Illinois, Iowa, Missouri, Wisconsin, Minnesota, and North Dakota before arriving at their final destination in Weyburn, Sask. on December 16th.

Support local food shelves by bringing cash or a healthy non-perishable food donation to the Holiday Train event: **Tuesday, December 11th**, Lions Park on 37th Ave, between 37th Ave & Stinson Blvd. The train arrives at 7:55 PM. Musical acts, The Trews and Willy Porter, perform from 8:15 – 8:45 PM.

Railroad Concerns



Marshall Terrace residents in certain areas experience issues with trains in the neighborhood.

People traveling through Ward One routinely call the City of Minneapolis with concerns regarding long delays at the railroad crossings on Central Avenue and Johnson Street NE near the Columbia Heights border.

The Ward One office has been in contact with Canadian Pacific (CP) Rail about these delays and CP has asked that anyone experiencing such delays report the matter to their Community Connect Office:
