Fall Street Sweeping & Yard Waste



Fall Street Sweeping

Street sweeping is one way in which the City of Minneapolis works to protect the environment; it keeps leaves and debris from clogging our storm drains and polluting our lakes and rivers. It also helps keep our neighborhoods clean and livable.

Minneapolis streets are swept completely curb to curb once in the spring and once in the fall. **This fall's sweep will begin Tuesday, October 18th.**

Streets will be posted at least 24 hours in advance. Parking on posted streets is prohibited from 7:00 AM – 4:30 PM.

Yard Waste Collection

Yard Waste Collection will end the week of November 14th, 2016.

Your last yard waste collection will be on your regularly scheduled garbage day during the week of November 14th.

Place yard waste out, prepared to collection guidelines, each week on your garbage day for collection. Minnesota state law prohibits disposing of yard waste with garbage and requires the use of compostable bags for collection of yard waste from your home.

Minneapolis Public Schools' 2016 Referendum

On November 8th, Minneapolis voters will be asked to renew the school district's current operating referendum authorization, which expires after the 2016–17 school year.

If passed, funding from the referendum would help Minneapolis Public Schools manage class sizes and provide supportive services and activities for students.

The request would authorize the referendum for nine years and be adjusted annually for inflation. Property taxes are not projected to increase if the referendum renewal passes.

What are we voting on?

Minneapolis voters will have the option to extend or discontinue an existing property tax referendum that is scheduled to expire after the 2016–17 school year.

If approved, the operating referendum funding will be used to manage class sizes and provide supportive services and activities for students.

If the referendum fails, MPS will have to make difficult decisions about how to operate the district

without a substantial portion of the budget. This may significantly impact class sizes and the current services and opportunities we provide students and families across the district.
