Election Day 2019 is **Tuesday, November 5th**.

To vote in Minnesota, you must be:

- A U.S. citizen
- At least 18 years old on Election Day
- A resident of Minnesota for 20 days
- Finished with all parts of any felony sentence

You can vote while under guardianship unless a judge specifically has revoked your right to vote.

You cannot vote if a court has ruled that you are legally incompetent.

Marshall Terrace Resident's Shoreline Buffer Project

Marshall Terrace neighbor Andy Wattenhofer invites you to visit the site of his Mississippi River shoreline buffer project at his home at **2648 Marshall Street** on **Saturday, October 19th**.

The project seeks to address stormwater runoff to the river by installing buffer materials on the riverbank to prevent or slow the flow of water directly into the river. This is the capstone project for Mr. Wattenhofer's Master Water Steward certification, and is sponsored by the Freshwater Society, Hennepin County, and the Mississippi Watershed Management Organization.

Storm water carries pollutants from roads, driveways, roofs, and other impervious surfaces into our waterways. The Mississippi River is the source of our Minneapolis drinking water, and is, of course, a natural asset we love for its wildlife and recreation. The goal of the shoreline buffer project is to restore the river bank to a more natural state by removing a concrete access road and replacing it with filtering stone rip rap and native plantings. Neighbors are invited to see the effects of the project in person and learn more about water quality issues in our neighborhood.

Plan to visit on **October 19th between 11:00 AM and 1:00 PM** to meet with Andy and learn about the project. Refreshments and snacks will be provided.

All are welcome, and please bring kids. The address is **2648 Marshall St NE**, and just follow the signs to the site down on the river.

2019 Fall Street Sweep Begins October 22nd

Minneapolis Public Works will begin the big task of curb-to-curb sweeping and leaf collection on streets throughout the city on Tuesday, Oct. 22. During the four weeks of the comprehensive fall street sweep, crews will clean about 1,000 miles of city streets. To make sure crews can do the best job possible, temporary “No Parking” signs will be posted at least 24 hours in advance so streets will be clear of cars when they’re swept. The first signs will be posted Monday, Oct. 21, and sweeping will begin the next day. Anyone who parks on the street will need to follow posted parking rules or their cars may be ticketed and towed.



Ways to stay informed of the parking rules:

- **“No Parking” signs** – City crews will post “No Parking” signs at least 24 hours before sweeping any streets. Parking will be banned from 7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on the day a street is swept. The “No Parking” signs will be removed as soon as possible after a street has been completely swept to allow people to resume parking. Vehicles not in compliance with “No Parking” signs may be ticketed and towed to the Minneapolis Impound Lot.
- **Social media** – The City will use Facebook and Twitter to post periodic street sweeping updates and information.

- **Phone calls to residents** – In addition to the “No Parking” signs that will be posted the day before sweepers come through, the City will make about 3,000 automated phone calls each evening to let residents know their street will be swept the next day. There’s no guarantee that the calls will reach everyone, so residents should be sure to check the various ways to be aware of the rules and watch for signs.
- **Interactive web feature** – Folks can use a feature on the City’s website to find out when the sweepers are coming through their neighborhoods. The tool will be available at www.minneapolismn.gov/streetsweeping once we get closer to the start date. The fall street sweep takes four weeks, and visitors to the website will be able to find out which week their street is scheduled to be swept. Then, on the weekend before each of the four weeks, the schedule for the upcoming week will be broken down to show which day of the week streets are scheduled to be swept.
- **Videos** – Street sweeping is explained in English, Hmong, Somali, and Spanish as part of a series of short videos that can be viewed at www.YouTube.com/cityofminneapolis.
